## New book published in Germany

## Berlin-Kuwait, a doctor in two worlds: Dr Fabricius

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 27: This book is first of all a report of my experience about over 15 years as a visiting professor here in Kuwait. I came over 116 times in this country to treat patient together with my former pupil Dr Ali Mehdi Zadeh and also with other colleagues in several Government Hospitals. The exchange of medical knowledge's with the physicians here in Kuwait and the contact to over 10,000 patient was for me very interesting. The conversation with a lot of people in Middle East was for me as a doctor from Europe a new investigation. I learned a lot about the history of Kuwait, about the culture of the Arab Peninsula, about the Islam and so on. Until now there was no book in Germany concerning the state of Kuwait available. So I was encouraged to write one.

But my publishing house in Berlin asked me to open not only a broad window of the world of Kuwait but also introduce Dr Ali and myself. So someone can read in this book now the history of my personal life in Danmark and Ger-

many and as well the history of Dr Ali in Kuwait.

Our teamwork here in Kuwait is a successful history. The Kuwaiti German Urology Unit and the Jarallah German specialized clinic are developing in the last years to a main center of health for a lot of patients. We offer all possibilities of treatment like I do in Germany. I'm happy to visit Kuwait now every month for some days.

Meanwhile I love this country and the Kuwaiti's and all the other people who are living here. The Ambassador of the state of Kuwait in Berlin told me I became now a half – Kuwaiti and I am proud for that.
